

Dear Pastor,

The night after your sermon, I found myself up past midnight, waiting for one of my printers to complete a task and reflecting on the women refugees who have been saved through your ministry. Time and time again, God brings good out of bad, doesn't He?

Then, like a bolt of lightning, it hit me—perhaps my 3D-printed crosses can do more than just invite people to church. I thought about John 3:16, and the sinner's prayer my mentor wanted to include, and suddenly, a profound realization struck me: A man whose life is in danger every day needs saving IMMEDIATELY—and he likely knows it.

I spoke with my mentor, and she wholeheartedly agreed to redirect the hundred crosses originally intended for her to the Ukrainian soldiers. Pastor, if there is any way to get these into the hands of the men and women fighting for Ukraine—and, quite frankly, even those fighting for Russia—please do so.

I have translated the prayer tag into Ukrainian and included an inspirational message, encouraging these soldiers to wear the cross. My deepest hope is that this small act of surrender and humility will open their hearts, allowing the Holy Spirit to make His presence known. If even one man comes to know Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior and recites the sinner's prayer because of these necklaces, it will be a blessing beyond measure.

I also believe you should include a tag—perhaps an inspirational message you share with the refugees. And if it is acceptable to you, maybe the soldiers could be instructed on how to perform a baptism in the field.

All praise to God the Father, Jesus Christ His Son, and the Holy Spirit who abides in all believers.

God bless you, Pastor, and thank you for all that you do.
